Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport Wins Air Cargo Excellence Award

(Anchorage, Alaska) – Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport (ANC) was presented the 2012 Air Cargo Excellence Award for the airport category of 1,000,000 or more tons by Air Cargo World. The Air Cargo Excellence Award is the result of quantitative feedback from ANC's cargo customer base of airlines. It is earned by achieving superior ratings from customers in four key areas: performance, value, facilities, and operations.
