

## **Project Update**

It's been awhile since you've heard from us. Since then a few things have changed. Originally, this project was planned to use 100% state funding for construction. In light of recent budget constraints, state funding to construct this project has been placed on hold. The Governor's office has requested that the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT&PF) revisit funding plans for all projects funded by General Obligation Bond sales, including the Kenai Spur Highway Rehabilitation project. However, there is potential for the project to be at least partially funded by the Federal Highway Administration. All preconstruction efforts (including design, environmental review, and permitting) will optimistically continue on the current schedule, with the anticipation that we will develop a successful funding plan by spring 2017.



## **Next Public Open House**

Keep an eye out for our next Public Open House coming in spring 2017. DOT&PF will provide new design information regarding construction sequencing for Phase 1 and what to expect during the 2 year project. DOT&PF will also share the latest design and construction schedule for Phase 2. The public will have an opportunity to provide feedback on the design and construction schedules and traffic control plans.
