## Your Input on the Quinhagak ALP Update Matters

The Native Village of Kwinhagak (NVK) and the Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities (DOT&PF) are working together to update the Airport Layout Plan (ALP) for Quinhagak Airport (AQH). The airport is owned and operated by NVK. The Quinhagak Airport is a general aviation airport located approximately 420 miles west of Anchorage and approximately 72 miles south of Bethel. Quinhagak has no other year-round transportation and relies on AQH for passenger, mail and, cargo service.

### Why does the ALP need updated?

The previous ALP was completed in 1997 and no longer serves as a guide for airport improvements. The updated ALP will document any changes in airport conditions since 1997 with a depiction of existing facilities and future planned development.

### Who is leading the update?

NVK and DOT&PF are leading the process, with assistance from a consulting team.

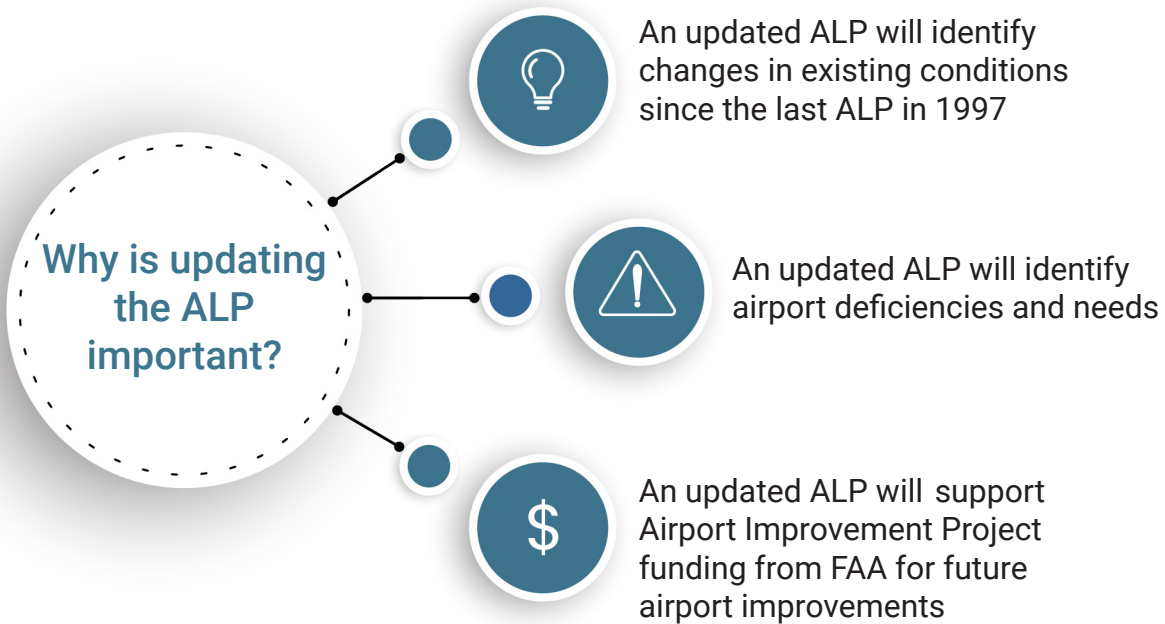

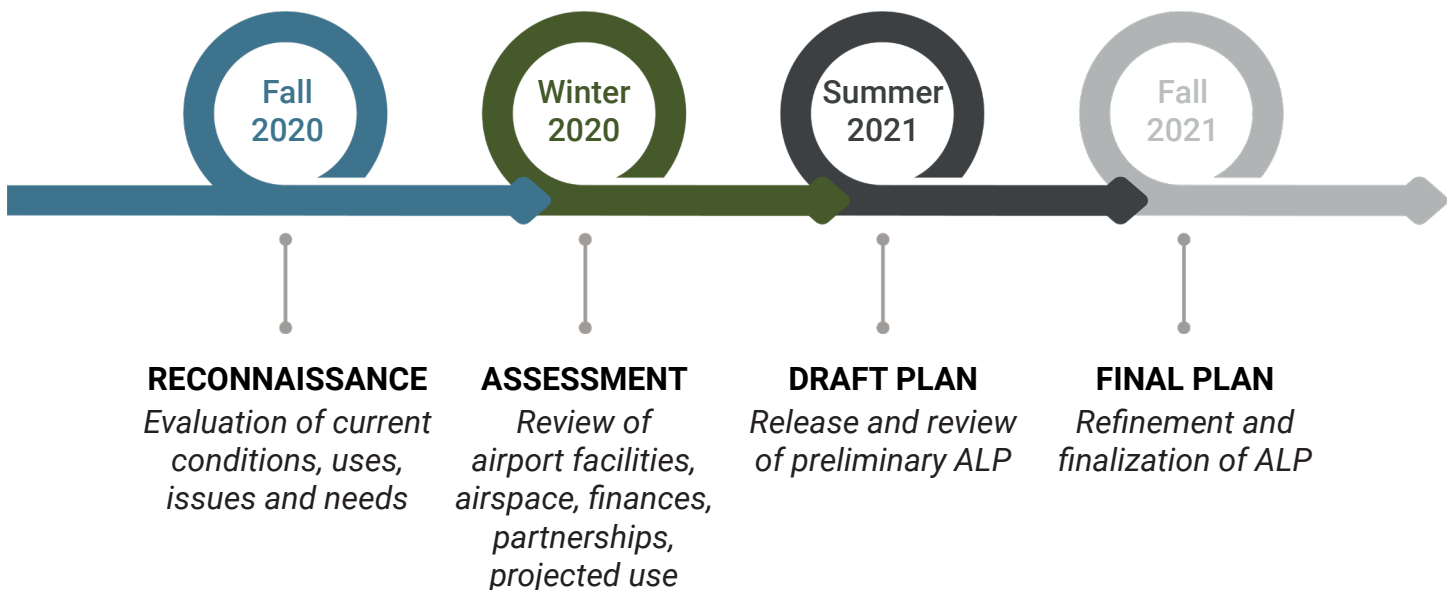
